

The New Mexico Maternal Mortality Review Committee

The New Mexico Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC) of the NM Department of Health (NM DOH) is recruiting members with a strong focus on communities most impacted by pregnancy-related deaths (rural, Native American, Black/African-American people). We also seek birth workers, those with violence prevention and community medicine and mental health expertise.

Maternal mortality is defined as “the death of a pregnant woman or a woman from any cause, within one year of the end of a pregnancy.” MMRC members review individual cases and overall data on maternal mortality, identify trends and patterns, and provide recommendations to the state, community partners and healthcare providers to reduce and prevent maternal deaths.

The MMRC seeks members with diverse perspectives on maternal health in New Mexico because communities, government officials, healthcare professionals, advocates, and birthing people must work together to prevent this tragic loss of life.
