#### INTRODUCTION

The New Mexico Early Childhood Education and Care Department (ECECD), through the Family Nutrition Bureau (FNB), is excited to announce \$300,000 in available grant funding for the New Mexico Grown (NM Grown) grant for early care and education providers. This funding is available to early care and education programs who meet certain eligibility criteria, including participation in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP), and wish to purchase foods grown, raised, harvested, or processed in New Mexico to serve to their children.

### **PURPOSE**

ECECD is expanding the NM Grown grant program for early care and education providers because it is critical to engaging families and improving the health and nutrition outcomes of young children in New Mexico. The purpose of this funding is to provide eligible early care and education providers participating in CACFP with the opportunity to purchase food grown, raised, or harvested in New Mexico. This opportunity will foster a connection between early care and education providers and local farms and farmers so that local foods can become staples for young children across New Mexico.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

The Application is open to licensed child care programs participating in, and in good standing with, CACFP. This includes the following types of programs:

- Child Care Centers, At-Risk Afterschool programs, and Emergency Shelters
- Head Start and Early Head Start programs, Al/AN Head Start, and Migrant/Seasonal Head Start, Licensed Adult Day Care facilities, Pre-K programs and Out of school time programs



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### **FUNDING**

Total Funding Available: \$300,000.00

• Minimum grant request: \$500.00 for a 12-month period

- Early care and education providers may, and are encouraged to, request the amount of funds for a 12-month period they deem necessary to purchase the desired quantity of New Mexico Grown products based on the number of children they serve. Any unspent funds will be returned to the Family Nutrition Bureau. Funding will be dispersed according to the size of the organization; Small organizations (less than 5,000 meals/snacks served per month) are eligible for \$500 to \$2,000. Medium sized organizations (greater than 5,000 but less than 10,000 meals/snacks served per month) are eligible for up to \$4,000 and Larger organizations (more than 10,000 meals/snacks served per month) are eligible for up to \$7,000.
- The amount awarded will be based on the justification of the amount requested and
  rationale outlined in the organization's purchasing plan regarding whether these costs are
  reasonable, and the number and size of requests received as compared to the funding
  that is available.

#### **ALLOWABLE USE OF FUNDS**

The funding is solely for the purchase of products that are grown, raised, harvested or produced in New Mexico. Products that may be purchased with this funding include, but are not limited to:

- Vegetables and/or fruits
- Herbs
- USDA inspected and certified meat products
- Honey
- Grains and/or flour
- Traditional foods (e.g., corn meal including blue corn mush and atole, chicos, hominy, etc.)
- Red Chile (in the form of sauce)
- Plant-based proteins (e.g., beans, tofu, seeds, nuts)

The Family Nutrition Bureau will work with providers to expand the list of products deemed allowable throughout the duration of the grant, and specific guidance on allowable New Mexico products will be provided in award letters.

#### REIMBURSEMENT

Grantees will be reimbursed through standard mechanisms established by the Family Nutrition Bureau. Grantees will be expected to email completed excel spreadsheet and receipts for reimbursement to the ECECD Family Nutrition Bureau (FNB) nutritionist for approval by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. ECECD will then process payments to the grantees.

Training on purchase tracking and reimbursement will be provided to all grantees.



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### PRIORITY FUNDING CRITERIA

Applications will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- 1) **Purpose and Goals.** A short statement explaining the purpose and objective for applying for the New Mexico Grown Grant.
- 2) Purchasing/Action plan. A purchasing plan that explains the grant amount requested, the types of New Mexico foods the grantee would like to purchase. Applications that discuss the purchase of local items throughout the year-in both warm and cold-weather months-will receive better evaluations. The proposed plan should include details about any existing relationships or potential vendors the program already works with and any established effort to purchase New Mexico products.
- 3) **Participation in Promotional Activities.** Included in the application should be a commitment to participate in at least 3 promotional programming activities, such as family engagement, participation in NM Grown Week, "Nuevo Thursdays", and Golden Chile awards.

### **DESCRIPTION OF EVALUATION CRITERIA:**

**Does Not meet Expectations:** This means the applicant omitted a very large portion of the requested information, failed to provide information, provided inaccurate information, or provided information that is hard to understand.

**Meets Expectations:** The applicant provides general but sufficient detail, and adequately addresses the criteria questions; however, some areas are not fully explained and/or questions remain for the Family Nutrition Bureau. In addition, the application may have some minor inconsistencies and weaknesses.

**Exceeds Expectations:** The applicant provided specific and comprehensive information and provided completed and clearly articulated responses to address the questions. The descriptions are detailed and the ideas are fully developed.

#### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS:**

All successful applications shall assure the Family Nutrition Bureau in writing that:

- 1) Food purchased is "local" as defined in this Grant Application;
- 2) Food is purchased from vendors on the ECECD "Approved Supplier Program List," (provided in the application) which certifies that the product originated on New Mexico farms that practice sound foods safety standards;
- 3) Local food purchases will be integrated into the organization's Child and Adult Care Food Program;
- 4) Invoices for reimbursement will be submitted via the required tracking sheet on a regular basis and in a timely manner; and



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5) Invoices will include the name of the approved supplier (vendor), name of produce, volume purchased, price, and any other details required by the FNB.

### **DEFINITIONS:**

"Fresh" means, Unprocessed or minimally processed

"Local" means, Grown, raised, and/or harvested within the geographic boundaries of New Mexico

"Minimally processed" means, a product that is frozen, dried, or ground/milled.

"New Mexico Grown Week" means, the event every fall where programs celebrate using New Mexico grown agricultural products to foster healthy childcare nutrition and expand NM growers' ability to keep their production local.

"Nuevo Thursdays" means, an activity of trying a new fruit or vegetable every Thursday.

"New Mexico Golden Chile Award" means, an annual award to programs that engage in NM Grown local food purchasing. Programs must apply for the award.

"Produce" means, the yield of a vegetable or fruit crop
